





LETTER TO OUR SUPPORTERS

2023 was the year of *Infrastructure* for EACH in Uganda and Kenya.

As the burden of COVID-19 and Ebola have eased, East Africa Children's Hope (EACH) is once again focused on funding sponsorships for Good Hope and Upendo students, creating opportunities for Upendo graduates and improving infrastructure with our partners in Kenya and Uganda.

A core mission of EACH is to bring education to the Good Hope Initiative in Uganda and to the girls from Upendo in Kenya. In 2023, we funded the Pioneers in their final year of their Advanced Certificate which gives them the foundation they need to obtain their Bachelor's Degree. This is how we set our students up for success. In 2023, five of our Upendo girls graduated from college or university. This educational pillar ensures they are able to start a career and become independent young women. Some EACH donors have supported these Upendo girls since they were in primary school. We are truly lucky for their continued support over the past 17 years.

EACH funded two large infrastructure projects at Good Hope that will change the community for generations to come. In 2023, biogas toilets were constructed and electricity was brought to Good Hope. The biogas toilets convert waste into biogas (a clean cooking fuel) and produce a nutrient-rich bio-slurry that can be used to fertilize agricultural fields. Biogas cooking fuel reduces the need to purchase other fuels and eliminates harmful indoor smoke from cooking with wood or charcoal. This infrastructure project benefited not only the kids who needed a new place to use the bathroom but also benefited everyone who cooks for the students; importantly, it saves money to be used for other operating costs. Perhaps even more exciting than biogas toilets, EACH was able to fundraise to bring electricity to GHI. In early fall 2023, the rural Uganda Electrification project brought electricity to Mubende, the nearest town to Good Hope. At that point it was up to EACH to fund the last few miles of electrification to bring electricity to the school and community center. EACH donors generously answered our call to support this important infrastructure initiative.

In Kenya, EACH and Upendo leadership partnered with the Kiriti Women's group, a local community organization, to create a restaurant entrepreneurship program for our recent college graduates. The Upendo Cafeteria entrepreneurship program in the center of downtown Murang'a gives recent EACH graduates real life experience while also allowing them to earn an income. In August 2023, The Upendo '02 Cafeteria had a successful grand opening. With the support of their mentor and EACH in-country coordinator, Joan Omini, these young women independently manage the restaurant, including procurement, finances to marketing, cooking and customer service. Since opening, the cafeteria has employed and trained six Upendo graduates, three who have advanced to other jobs.

2023 was another productive and rewarding year for our students and a year of great infrastructure improvements. We look forward to 2024 and all it will bring for the EACH Kids.

Sustainability at Good Hope

In spring 2023, Good Hope began construction on biogas toilets.

This biogas initiative will serve our school for years to come and we thank our donors for their generosity in supporting it.















Electricity at Good Hope

EACH donors provided Good Hope not only with Love, but Light

In 2023, EACH was able to bring something to Good Hope that we never thought possible - electricity! Electricity is out of reach for most rural Ugandans. Prior to this year, Good Hope was a part of the 64% of communities in rural Uganda who do not have access to electricity. In early fall 2023, the rural Uganda Electrification project brought electricity to Mubende, the nearest town to Good Hope. At that point it was up to EACH to fund the last few miles of electrification to bring electricity to the school and community center. EACH donors generously answered our call to support this important infrastructure initiative. The students no longer need to worry about cloudy days, their classrooms being too dark or not being able to study at night because the students now have lights. Good Hope is now in the planning and feasibility phase for bringing technology, such as a computer lab, to ensure the students at Good Hope can be on par with their peers around the world.







Entrepreneurship in Kenya

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In Kenya, EACH partnered with the Kiriti Women's group, a local community organization, to create a restaurant entrepreneurship program for our recent college graduates. The Kiriti Women's group provided the location for the restaurant, funded renovations to the space and raised half of the necessary start-up costs to fund licensing, equipment, furniture and the first three months of operating expense. EACH raised the other half of the funds to give these girls a jump start on their careers.

The Upendo Cafeteria entrepreneurship program in the center of downtown Murang'a, gives recent EACH college graduates real life management, supply chain and food service experience while also allowing them to earn an income. The Upendo '02 Cafeteria opened in August 2023 with a successful grand opening and first few months! The cafeteria is helping the EACH sponsored college graduates develop the skills needed to forge their way in the world post-graduation. With the support of their mentor and EACH in-country coordinator, Joan Omini, these young women independently manage the restaurant including procurement, management, finances, marketing, cooking and customer service. Since opening, the cafeteria has employed and trained six Upendo graduates, three who have already advanced to other jobs.
